Because the population above 110 years old is very small and includes mostly females, information of age and gender might be nearly enough to identify some of the donors. In addition, there are lists of supercentenarians with full name, age, gender, and location in the Internet. It might have an unfavorable impact on donors and their families, if somebody combines genetic information such as SNPs and the publicly available information. Therefore, in addition to the NBDC policy, we require data user to comply with the following restrictions in addition to the NBDC policy. If any of the following restrictions are found to have been violated, you are asked to withdraw the submitted papers related to the data and the NBDC may take one or more further actions such as rescinding of permission for data use, reporting of the fact to the head of the organization to which you belong, announcing of the fact on the website etc., and so on.

[RESTRICTIONS]

- 1. Data users should not describe genetic information such as SNPs for individual donors when they publish results using this dataset in papers and presentations.
- 2. Data users must not attempt to re-identify or examine genetic relationships within a family using sequencing data combined with clinical and familial information from datasets beyond the original study purpose.
